1 A Brief Guide to Using the System

The legal information search system supported by artificial intelligence is available at the following web address: <https://jog.gov.hu/>

For general users:

The question field on the Portal's homepage allows users to ask questions of legal relevance formulated in everyday language.

By clicking in the field, users can see frequently asked questions, and later on, they will also be able to view their previously asked questions.

After the question has been submitted, a summary response supported by artificial intelligence will appear, which is based on the legal documents deemed relevant by the system.

Next to the summary response is a list of **Referenced Laws**, containing the list of legal documents used in the response. By clicking on the header of the items in the list, the user is redirected directly to the **National Legislation Database** (hereinafter "NJT", www.njt.hu) page, where the full text can be viewed.

For professional users:

On the homepage, there is an option to navigate to the Professional Search Tool. By using the search field located at the top of the page, the user can enter the terms searched for or even ask questions of legal relevance formulated in everyday language.

By clicking in the search field, users can see frequently asked questions, and later on, they will also be able to view their previously asked questions.

After starting the search, a results list will appear containing legal documents deemed relevant by the system. By clicking on the heading of the legal documents, the user is redirected directly to the **National Legislation Database** (hereinafter "NJT", www.njt.hu) page, where the full text can be viewed.

2 Access Options to the System

2.1 Use without registration

Currently, the basic services of the portal can be accessed by ("unidentified") users without registration without providing any data.

2.2 Use with the Central Identification Agent

In the near future, a registration option will be introduced for users. Registered and logged-in users will have access to additional personalised services and supplementary features beyond the current basic functions.

3 Detailed Description of User Activities

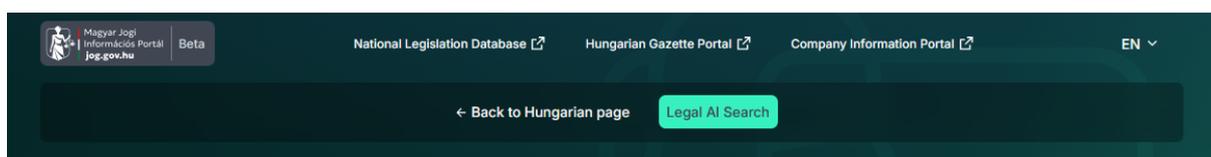
The public interface of the Közlöny 2.0 portal (Hungarian Official Gazette 2.0) portal provides citizens with access to the artificial intelligence-supported legal search tool, as well as the

Hungarian Official Gazette, sectoral journals, legal news, and other official documents, and also a link to the National Legislation Database interface. The interface serves to display the above information in a transparent and searchable manner.

Functions of the main page

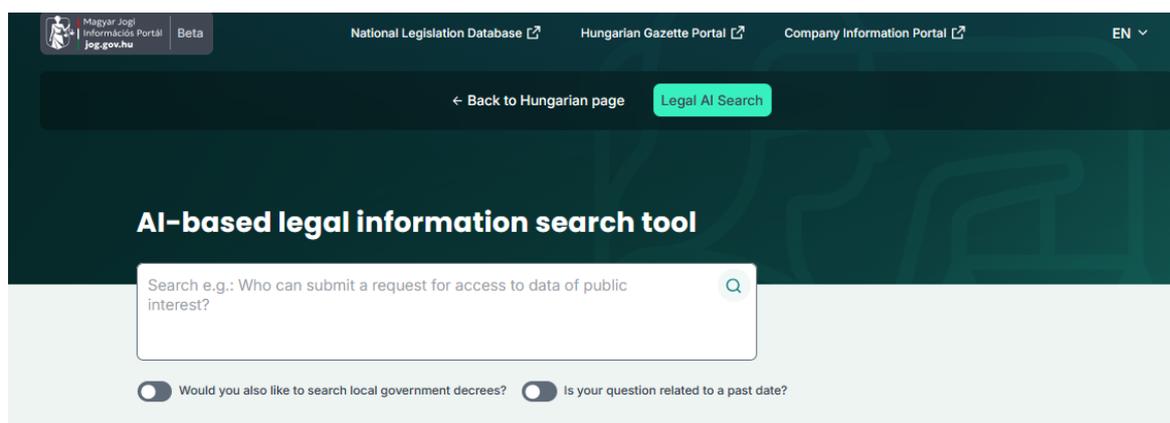
3.1 Legal AI search tool

3.1.1 Introduction to the search interface

The system's main search interface helps users in various ways to find legal information quickly and efficiently. The user interface design is simple and clear, supporting questions formulated in everyday language, as well as conventional keyword search.

The main elements of the search interface:

- **Question field:** This is where keywords, questions in everyday language, or specific references to laws (the number, title, abridged name of a law, as well as specific legal provisions) can be entered.
- **Submit question button:** Starting the search based on the terms or questions entered.



3.1.1.1 Search methods

The system provides users with multiple search options:

3.1.1.1.1 Semantic questions

Users can formulate their questions in full sentences, using everyday language. They may also provide a brief description of the specific life situation that the question refers to before asking the question.



 **Examples:**

- *Who can submit a request for access to data of public interest?*
- *How can a Hungarian child born in Denmark obtain Hungarian documents?*
- *My neighbour has knocked down my fence. What can I do?*
- *I want to sell a recently inherited house. Can I do it in any way before the conclusion of the probate proceedings?*
- *There are several prices indicated on a blazer in the store. At which price can I purchase it?*

Of course, it is also possible to simply provide keywords. A semantic search is performed in this case as well, which means that the system will interpret the meaning of the words entered and search for related legal information.

 **Examples:**

- *vehicle import tax*
- *labour law leave pregnant woman*
- *property acquisition duty*

The system is capable of recognising acronyms and abbreviations. If the system recognises an abbreviation entered, it will automatically consider its full form during the search. The glossary of acronyms is constantly expanding, so it is possible that during the trial period, the system does not yet recognise certain abbreviations.

 **Examples:**

- *What is NEBEK?*
- *How much additional leave is granted to the Secretary General of the MMA?*
- *What are the duties of the MNB?*

The system allows users to include direct references to laws or legal provisions within the question. In such cases, the system prepares the summary response based on the law identified, and the laws concerned appear in the list of referenced laws.

In everyday practice, references to laws can have various forms. Several reference methods are already recognised by the system, and this capability is continually expanded as it is developed.



Examples:

- According to Act V of 2013, what does a maintenance contract mean?
- What does Section 113 of the Labour Code prescribe about extraordinary work?
- Section 4 of Act LXXV of 2023

3.1.1.1.2 Asking a question in a foreign language

The system allows for asking questions in foreign languages as well. In this case, the operation is identical to the process applied in Hungarian-language searches.

The user can formulate their question in any supported foreign language, and the system will interpret its content in the same way, providing a summary response based on relevant Hungarian laws.

It is important to note the following:

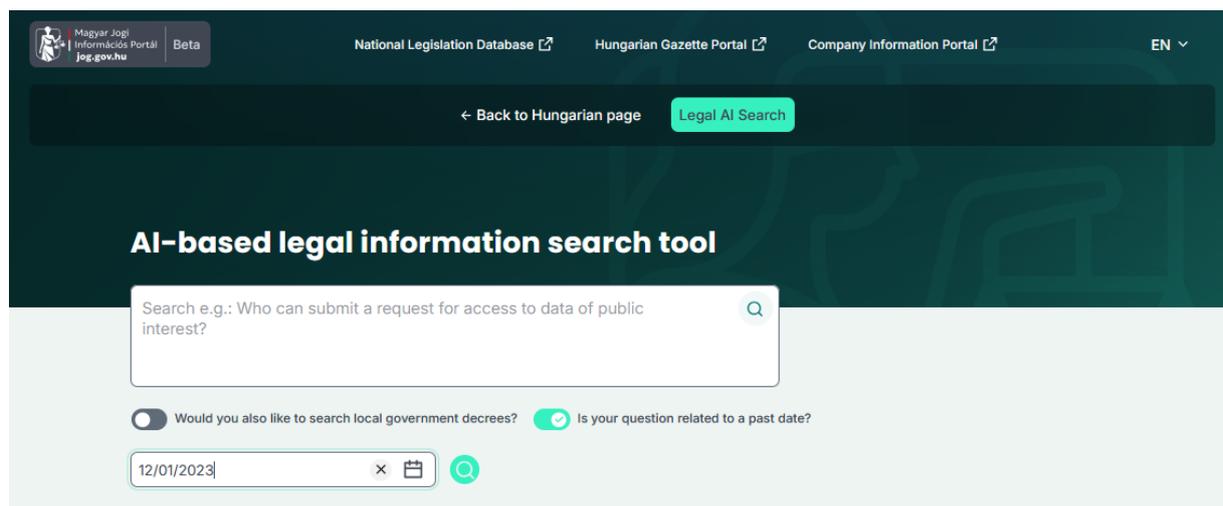
- The automatically generated textual summary response is created in the language of the question, so the user will receive information, interpreted and summarised by the system, in their mother tongue or in a foreign language chosen by them.
- The list of referenced laws, however, contains the original Hungarian-language documents.

This feature can be particularly useful for foreign users who wish to navigate the Hungarian legislative environment but do not have adequate Hungarian language skills.

3.1.1.1.3 Search for legal information valid on a given date

The system allows the user to ask a question regarding a specific (past or future) date.

The date concerned can be specified by activating the checkbox "Does your question refer to a different date?" located under the question field.

After selecting the date, the system prepares the summary response based on the laws in force at the time specified.

3.1.1.1.4 Type of question (specification of relevant laws)

The system allows the user to specify the scope of laws within which they wish to receive an answer: national laws or local government decrees. This setting helps ensure that the response is more precise and relevant to the specific legal level.

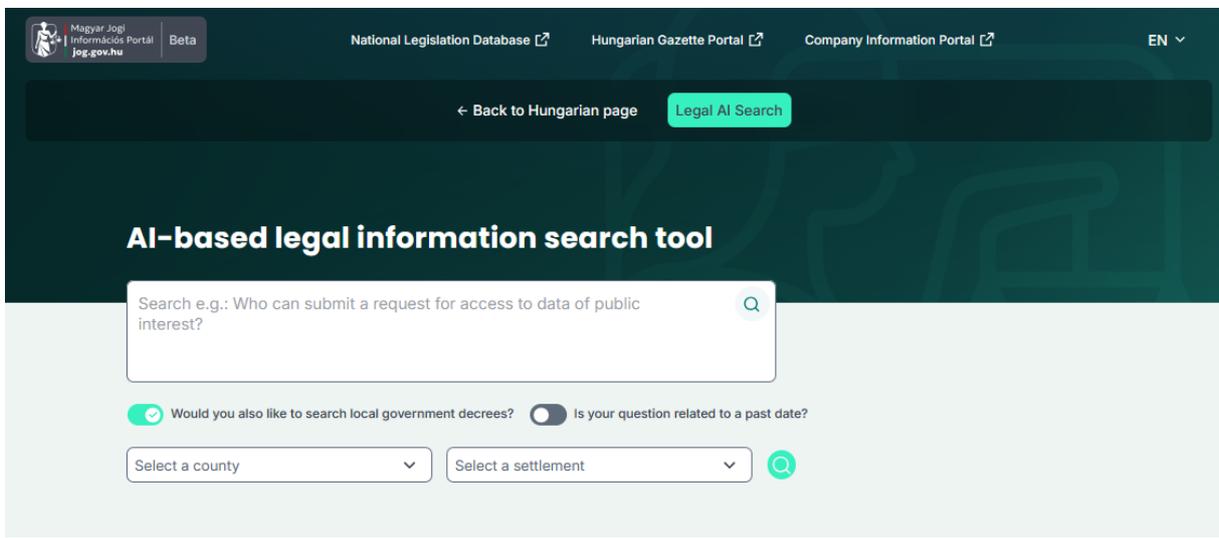
3.1.1.1.4.1 National laws

Questions regarding national laws can be asked as described above.

3.1.1.1.4.2 Local government decrees

Users have the option to search for local government decrees by activating a checkbox.

By activating the button, the county and municipality selector will appear on the screen, allowing the user to specify which local government's decrees they want the answer to be based on. The user must provide the county in this case, while providing the municipality is not compulsory.

3.1.1.2 Display of the response

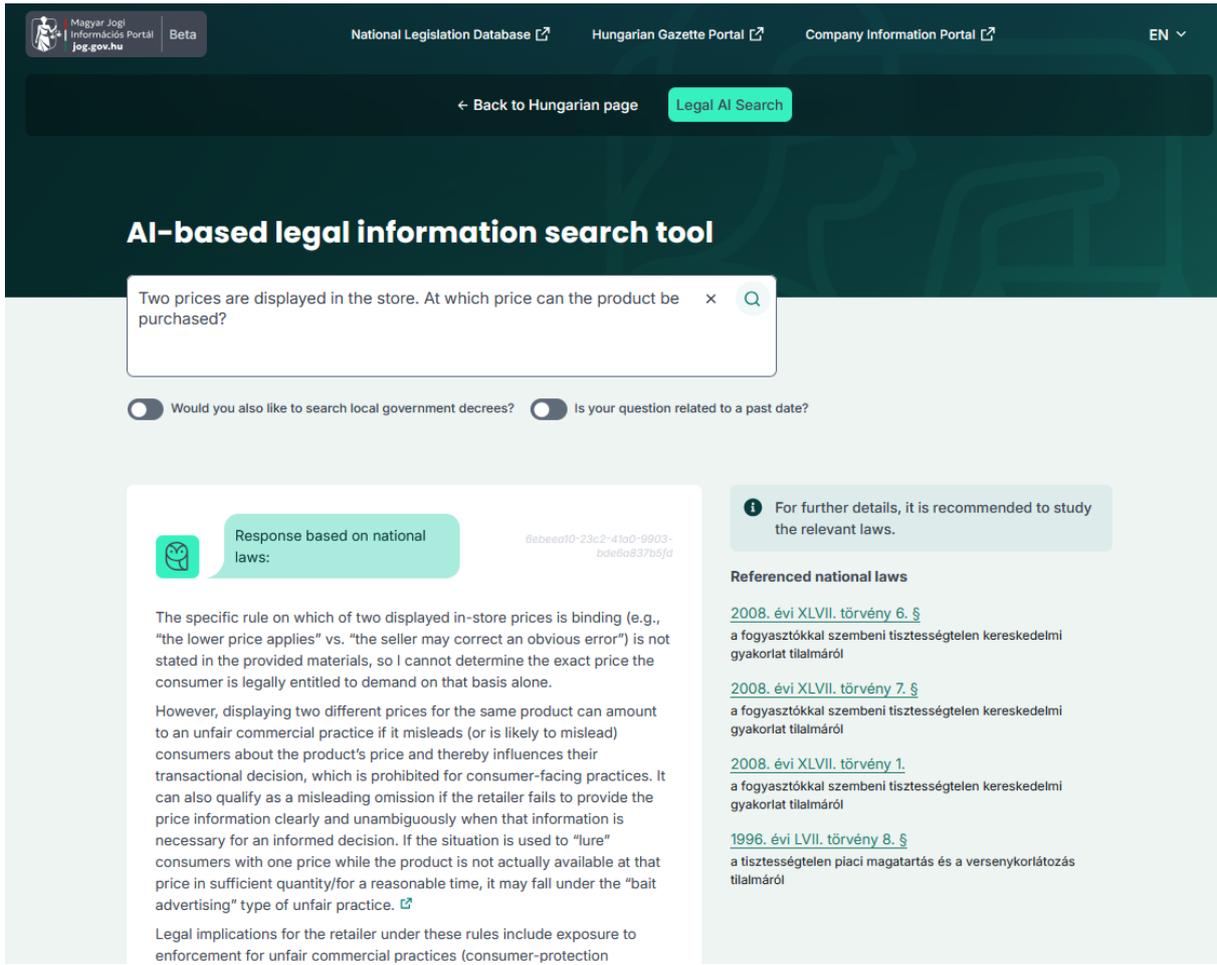
After interpreting the question asked by the user, the system displays a summary response based on the relevant laws.

The purpose of the response is to clearly summarise the legal situation and assist the user in understanding which rules apply to the case concerned.

3.1.1.2.1 Summary response

A key feature of the system is the provision of textual summary responses, which significantly facilitates the interpretation of legal information for users.

The more precise and detailed the question is, the more comprehensive and accurate response the user can expect. Therefore, it is recommended to use full sentences, ideally in everyday but clear language.

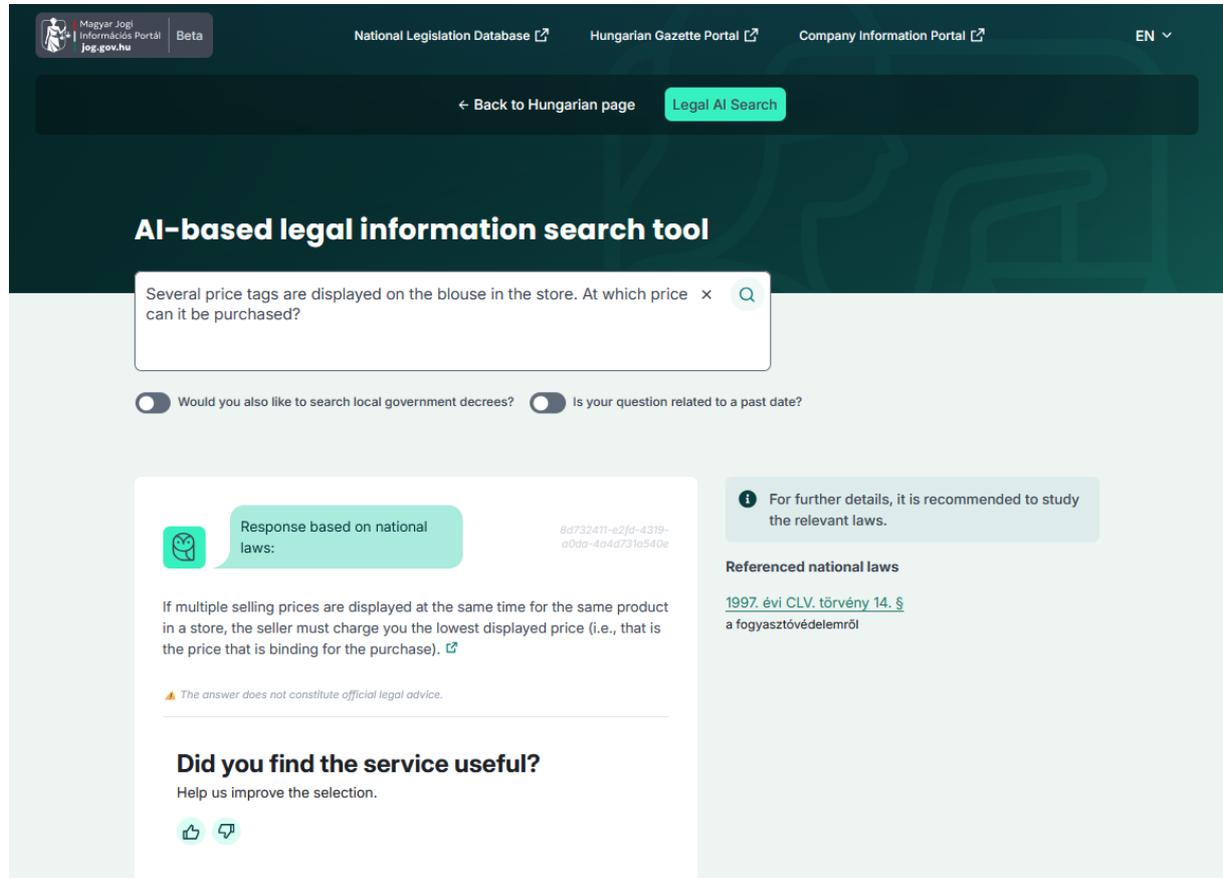

3.1.1.2.2 List of referenced laws

Alongside the summary response, the list of referenced national laws and the referenced local government decrees also appear.

The individual elements of the list contain the title of the given legal document, which, when clicked on, redirects the user directly to the appropriate page of the National Legislation Database (NJT), where the full legal document can be viewed.

3.1.1.3 Sending user feedback

The user may provide feedback below the summary response.

The textual summary response generated by the system can be evaluated by pressing the "Like" -  - or "Don't like" -  - button, which will automatically send the feedback. The user has a single assessment option for each response.
